



USADGC Qualifying Process Guidelines

The following explains the Qualifying Process for the PDGA United States Amateur Championship presented by Discraft.

- The top 40% of PDGA Amateur players
 - Based off of membership beginning from the 1st Ratings update on March 1st per each calendar year
- The top 35% of the PDGA MAI Division in the following PDGA Events:

○ The Masters Cup	○ Australia Open
○ The PDGA Amateur Worlds Championship	○ The Las Vegas Championship
○ The European Amateur Open	○ The Memorial
○ The Brent Hambrick Memorial	○ The IDGC Amateur Championships
○ The Ledgestone	○ The Amateur Championship at Bowling Green
○ The (Japan) National Championship	○ Glass Blown Open

*NOTE: Other events may be added based on location and past merit

- The top 35% of the PDGA MAI division from an event selected by each PDGA State/Provincial Coordinator held in their US State or Canadian Province. Said event must be:
 - A PDGA sanctioned event, A or B Tier only
 - Submitted and approved by the USADGC committee
 - Events whose date is 1 month prior to the USADGC will be a qualifier for the following year
 - Deadline: No later than February 1 per each calendar year
- The top 35% of the PDGA MAI division from All MDGO Feature Events including the Discraft Michigan State Championships:
 - Events whose date is 1 month prior to the USADGC will be a qualifier for the following year
- All PDGA Amateur players who have not already qualified at an approved Qualifying Event whose Player Rating meets or exceeds the guidelines below until the event is filled at 144 players
 - If a players' rating is 920 or higher by the April PDGA Ratings Update
 - If a players' rating is 940 or higher by the May PDGA Ratings Update

**REGISTRATION NOTE:

All players must be a current Amateur PDGA Member and a PDGA Certified Official through the end of the month of June in order to be able to register for the USADGC. Be sure to check your membership and official's status before attempting to register.
